Foreword

"Heritage of the past is the seed that brings forth the harvest of the future." The saying has a special significance for the Punjab where scarcity of original sources of information is acutely felt. Vast numbers of old manuscripts are still found in private custody or have been acquired by learned institutions outside the state.

How difficult it is to bring together widely scattered relics and records can be adequately realized only by those who have been engaged in this arduous task. The thrill of discovery and the satisfaction that the new finds may help to reconstruct our history sustain the explorer in his painstaking, though often unrewarding, labours.

As soon as the unknown and untapped manuscripts and documents have been salvaged or traced, their proper utilization by Research Scholars and others interested in their detailed study, requires attention. Consolidated information about all such valuable collections is, therefore, desired to be furnished to the public through suitable reference media. A descriptive catalogue on a standard pattern prescribed by Government of India would bring the materials extant at the Sikh History Research Department of the Khālsā College, Amritsar, to the notice of a much wider clientele and promote original research.

The Sikh History Research Department Khālsā College Amritsar has been steadily enriched by the strenuous and sustained efforts of its energetic stewards during the last over thirty years. Fired with the missionary zeal to collect data pertaining to the history of the Sikhs in particular and to the modern Punjab in general, they have explored all possible avenues to build up a research institution in the state. Detailed information about the fruits of their labours is available in the catalogue. In addition to the original texts collected by the Department transcribed or photographed copies have been procured from varied sources like government agencies, family and individual collections, learned institutions and libraries within or outside Punjab. Prolonged search and patient labours have produced the results which are now available at one place for the convenience of researchers.

Shri Kirpāl Singh, who has been Incharge of the Department since 1950, has contributed his share to the rich harvest. The classified descriptive catalogue produced by him with the generous financial help of the Govt. of India is a creditable achievement. Although drawn up on the set pattern evolved by the Central Govt. for the catalogue, he has elaborated it by giving a critical appraisal of the outstanding items in the Preface and comments on their significance under the appropriate column in the table. The information furnished therein will be found to be fairly detailed for any one to form a clear idea of the value of manuscripts and documents brought together at the Sikh History Research Department.

Preface

The Khālsā College Amritsar has been running, since 1930, a history research section called Sikh History Research Department. This is in fact an institution in itself which is the only one of its kind in the Punjāb. The chief objective of this institution is to conduct researches on the modern history of the Punjāb viz. from 1469 A.D. to date, which incidently forms the Sikh history period. The results of the researches conducted in this institution have been published from time to time in the form of research monographs etc. Some of the important and rare manuscripts have also been published by this institute. So far it has published about a dozen works in English, Persian, Ūrdū and Punjābi. Some of its important publications are :-

6. Dewān Kaurā Mal Bahādur (Punjābi) by S. Gandā Singh. (Out of Print).
7. History of Khālsā College, Amritsar, (English).
8. The Biographical Sketches of Bhāi Vasti Rām and Bhāi Rām Singh in English by S. Kirpāl Singh, with an introduction of Dr. Mohan Singh M.A., Ph.D., D. Litt.
9. Sikhān-de-Sewā (Punjābi) a brief account of humanitarian work done by the Sikhs of Calcuttā during the riots of 1946 by S. Kirpāl Singh with introduction by Principal Tejā Singh.

One of the aims and objects of Sikh History Research Department is to collect data pertaining to the history of the Modern Punjāb and history of the Sikhs in particular. For this purpose in view long tours have been undertaken and every effort has been made to collect material from far off places. Different scribes worked to prepare the transcribed copies or extracts copies of the manuscripts selected by Professors Incharge, Sikh History Research Department. The following table will give an idea of the mss. transcribed from the libraries noted below :-

One of the efficient scribes who worked for Sikh History Research Department was Faizūl Huq. He worked at various places under the wise guidance of S. Gandā Singh, then Professor Incharge Sikh History Research Department. He transcribed twenty five manuscripts (mss). His transcribed works have got detailed table of contents, headings and sub-headings in red.

The important dates, name of the author and date of compilation, if available were prominently mentioned by him. In case he found two copies of the same manuscript from two different places he compared the text of the both and mentioned the variations in his marginal notes.

Where the facilities of the photostat apparatus existed the photostat copies were acquired. The photostat copies of some of the very important manuscripts relating to the Punjāb have been procured from British Museum and India Office Library, London and recently from Punjāb University Library, Lāhore (Pākistān). The photographic copies of important documents preserved in the Punjāb Government Record Office and historical documents in private collections have also been collected for the benefit of research and study. Besides this some original documents have also been acquired. Majmohiā-i-Mūraslāt (S.H.R 2) containing six original letters addressed to important persons and Parwānājāt Mahārājā Dalip Singh (S.H.R. 1433) containing seventeen documents are original Persian records preserved in the Sikh History Research Department.

Two recent additions of the Persian Manuscripts to Sikh History Research Department are worth mentioning. In 1950 we selected 24 manuscripts and rare books from the Nawābs of Kūnjpurā Library, which the Custodian Department subsequently transferred to the Sikh History Research Department after settling their prices in 1960. General Shivdev Singh of Nābhā recently donated about 80 Persian Manuscripts. These included forty two mss. on Rāgās. The other manuscripts relate to very wide range of subjects – like fine art, art of calligraphy medicine, riddles, and literature etc. In several manuscripts text is illustrated by beautiful paintings on various pages. This gift made a colourful addition and brought a very rich variety of subjects in our collection which had hitherto been a purely historical one.

Some of the important manuscripts which are of special significance for the research scholars are noted below :-

Tāriḫ-i-Punjāb Bāte Shāh (S.H.R. 1388-89)

It is a detailed history of the Punjāb upto 1839 A.D. It has been acknowledged as one of the authentic accounts of the Sikhs by eminent writers like J. D. Cunningham who considered it to be "One of the best known accounts." The author was the employee of the British and had visited the Court of Maharaj Ranjit Singh. This ms. is, therefore, very valuable for the period of Maharaja Ranjit Singh viz 1799-1839 A.D.

Tāriḳh-i-Sikhān by Khūshwaqat Rāi, S.H.R. No. 1274 and 116.

It is very valuable manuscript dealing with the history of the Sikhs from Guru Nanak (1469-1539) to 1811 A.D. It was compiled at the instance of Sir Charles Metcalf. Prinsep and Captain Murray based their accounts of the Sikhs on this manuscript. The author was the intelligencer of the British and lived in Amritsar. This ms. therefore, gives minute details of early Sikh History which is the result of his intimate association with the Sikhs.

Chahār Gūlshan-i-Punjāb by Ganesh Dāss, S.H.R. No. 1721.

It is an important work on the history of the Punjāb and more particularly on history of the Sikhs. It begins with the ancient history of the Punjāb and ends with the annexation of the Punjāb in 1849 A.D. It was compiled in 1849 by Ganesh Dāss who was the Qanāngo of Gūjrāt during the reign of Mahārājā Ranjit Singh. The author has given very valuable account of the rise of the Sikhs as he was intimately connected with the region in which Maharaja's power was first established.

Khalsā Nāmāh by Bakhat Mal, S.H.R. 1659.

It is very important for the history of the Punjāb during later 18th Century. Mr. John Malcolm used this manuscript for writing his "Sketch of the Sikhs." The author was the Munshi of Dewān Gangā Rām who had served eminent persons of his time. Dewān Gangā Rām was subsequently employed by Mahārājā Ranjit Singh. So the author had closely observed the events which he subsequently put to pen.

'Ibrat Namāh 'Ali-ūddin, S.H.R. No. 1277.

It is a very important manuscript on the history of the Punjāb. It relates the topographical and geographical details about the Punjāb and detailed history of the Sikhs upto-1849 A.D. The author belonged to Lāhore and had migrated to Ludhiānā in 1824 A.D. where he took service with the British. He has written very comprehensive account of the Punjāb with special reference to political, social and religious back ground. This ms. also furnishes very valuable information about the reign of Mahārājā Ranjit Singh.

Tuzik-i-Shāh Shūjāh, S.H.R. No. 94.

It is the autobiography of Shāh Shūjāh the deposed King of Afghānistan. It gives first hand information regarding his dealing with Mahārājā Ranjit Singh, his stay at Ludhianā and First Afghān War. The author was victim of the circumstances and he has himself narrated the account of his chequered career.

Shir-o-Shakar by Pandit Dayā Rām, S.H.R. No. 399

This was compiled in 1814 A.D. Earlier the author had been an eye-witness of important events at Delhi. Later on he joined the service of Maharaja Ranjit Singh through Dewān Gangā Rām. Hence it gives very valuable contemporary account of Maharaja's expeditions and conquests.

Tadhkirā-i-Anand Rām, S.H.R. No. 94

This manuscript is very important for the history of the Punjāb during first half of 18th century as it gives first hand information regarding so many events in which author himself was present. The author has given a graphic account of the first invasion of Ahmad Shāh Abādli in 1748 A.D. as he accompanied the forces of Wazir Qammarāddin against the Afghān invader.

Memoirs of Tāhmās Khān 'Miskin', S.H.R. 1283.

It is a photostat copy acquired from the British Museum. Tāhmās Khān had served the most eminent personages of his time like Mir Manno, Mughlāni Begam, Zain Khān etc. He, therefore, gives first rate information regarding them. It is one of the most important sources regarding the eighteenth century history of the Punjāb.

Akhbār-i-Darbār-i-Mau'lā, S.H.R. 530 (a & b).

The rulers of Jaipūr state had employed their own chroniclers who used to record day to day events of the Mughal Court. The Jaipur Records, therefore, supply very valuable information. The news items collected in these volumes relate to the Punjāb and throw light on rise of Bandā Bahādur and his arrest by the Mughal forces.

Akhbār-i-Darbār-i-Mau'lā (Poona), S.H.R. 603

Like Jaipūr state, the Marāthās at Poonā used to have their own news-writers who wrote news items in Persian. They belonged to particular families known as Pārsanis. These news-items are also called Pārsanis papers. These relate to the activities of the Sikhs in the cis-Sutlej territory during 18th century especially of Rājā Gajpat Singh of Jind, and Sardār Baghel Singh etc. These constitute an important source of information for the Sikh history.

Akhbārāt-i-Mūtfarqā, S.H.R. 521.

This transcribed volume contains news items relating to the period from 1756 A.D. to 1798 A.D. These news items throw a flood of light on the activities of the Sikhs, invasions of Ahmad Shāh Abādli, relations of Jāts of Bharatpur with Najib etc. These news items have been collected from Jaipūr as well as from Poonā.

Parwānājāt Mahārājā Dalip Singh, S.H.R. No. 1433.

These are original documents recently discovered. These were issued after First Sikh War and relate to different items. One has been addressed to all Jagirdārs and Kārdārs of Lāhore Kingdom exhorting them to co-operate with the British for supply of provision etc.

Parwānājāt Sardar Chattar Singh and Shēr Singh Attārī,
S.H.R. No. 1264-65

These documents throw light on the administration of Kashmir during the post Ranjit Singh period of 1839-1849 A.D. Some of them relate to the Second Sikh War, Some documents are important for the economic history of the period as rates of different commodities are mentioned there. The transcribed copies of these document have been secured from the descendants of the Kārdārs working in the Jāgirs of S. Chattar Singh.

Mūraslāt Ahmed Shāh Dūrrāni, S.H.R. 564.

These letters are very important for the history of Northern Western India during later half of 18th century as these throw a flood of light on the political condition of middle eighteen century. These letters have been addressed to the Afghān King by various Indian Chiefs.

Tāirkh-i-Mūzafarī by Mohammad 'Ali Khān Ansārī, S.H.R. 424.

It has been considered as one of "the best histories of 18th century" It delineates the gradual decline of Mughal Empire and subsequent rise of the British, the Marāthās, the Sikhs, the Afghāns and the Rohillās. It furnishes very valuable information concerning the history of the Punjāb.

Ahwāl-i-Bayāz-i-Kashmīr by Nārāin Kāul, S.H.R. 2197.

It gives very useful information about Kashmir and its rulers from ancient times. It also gives the accounts of various governors who ruled Kashmir during the Mūslim period. Since the author belonged to Kashmir he has given the details with personal intimacy.

Waqā-i-Jang-i-Sikhān, S.H.R. 1795.

It is a photostat copy acquired from Punjab University Library, Lāhore (Pakistan) in 1956. The author Dewān Ajudhyā Prasād was present in the First Anglo-Sikh War and he has given first hand information of the events. The author, in his narrative of the battles, has, however tried to justify the conduct of Lāl Singh by giving pro-British version.

Zabdatul Akhbar-Waqā-i-Multān, S.H.R. No. 7.

It deals with the history of Multān from the Muslim period to the conquest of Multān by Mahārājā Ranjit Singh. The expeditions of the Sikhs to Multān have been given in detail.

'Ibrat Nāmāh by Mirzā Mohammad Harṭhī, S.H.R. 231.

It is very valuable ms. for the history of the Punjāb from 1795 A.D. to 1719 A.D. as the author gives an eye-witness accounts of the rising of the Sikhs under Bandā Bahādūr.

'Ibrat Nāmāh Khair-ūddin, S.H.R. 555, 563 and 67.

This ms. is very important for the events 1760 to 1785 A.D. as it gives year wise account of those days. It gives a lot of information about the Mughal Emperor's relations with Marāthās and the Britishers. It also refers to the exploits of the Sikhs.

Tārikh-i-Hūssain Shāhi, S.H.R. No. 104.

This ms. gives the contemporary and eye witness account of later half of 18th century. The author accompanied Zamān Shāh to Kābūl and on his return compiled this work in 1798 A.D.

Haqiqat-i-Binā-wā-Arūj-i-Firqā-i-Sikhān, S.H.R. 1283.

It is a photostat copy. The author is Timār Shāh Durrāni. It is a short history of the Sikhs from Gūrū Nānak to the conquest of Multān by Timār Shāh. It supplies very valuable and useful information about the Sikhs and their rise.

Ahwāl-i-Bhāu wā Ahmad Shāh Durrāni by Kāshi Rāj S.H.R. 45.

This ms. gives one of the most significant accounts of the Third Battle of Pānipāt in 1761 A.D., which was one of the most important events of 18th century. The author was himself present in the battle. His account is considered as one of the best accounts.

Tārikh-i-Kūnjpūra, S.H.R. No. 2116.

This ms. gives the history of Kūnjpūrā state. It narrates an account of the foundation of Kūnjpūrā and its subsequent history including warfare between Kūnjpūrā (near Karnāl) and neighbouring Sikh state of Jind.

Ahwāl-i-Aulyā-i-Khūdā, S.H.R. No. 2117.

It is a very interesting ms. from theological point of view. The names of different Mūslim saints and their the long discourses and dialogues on

mysticism etc. have been given there. At the end a life sketch of Khawājā Muyāddin Chīsti has been given.

My thanks and compliments are due to Col. Sir Būtā Singh C. B. E., Vice-President, Khālsā College, Amritsar, for taking keen interest in this project and for the encouragement given to me in accomplishing this work. I am grateful to Principal Sardār Shām Singh for his kind co-operation, Shri V. S. Sūrī, Director of Archives Patialā who despite of his other engagements, acceding to my request went through the manuscript of this catalogue, suggested improvement and wrote its Foreward to Professor Dr. Tāran Singh who read its Preface and gave valuable suggestions and Shri Lachhman Dāss Shāiq, who assisted me in the preparation of the catalogue of literary manuscripts and read the proofs of Persian text.

This work would have not been accomplished so soon had Ministry of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs, New Delhi, not approved and financed. this project. In this respect I am thankful to Shri V. P. Agnihotri, under Secretary, Ministry of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs, New Delhi.

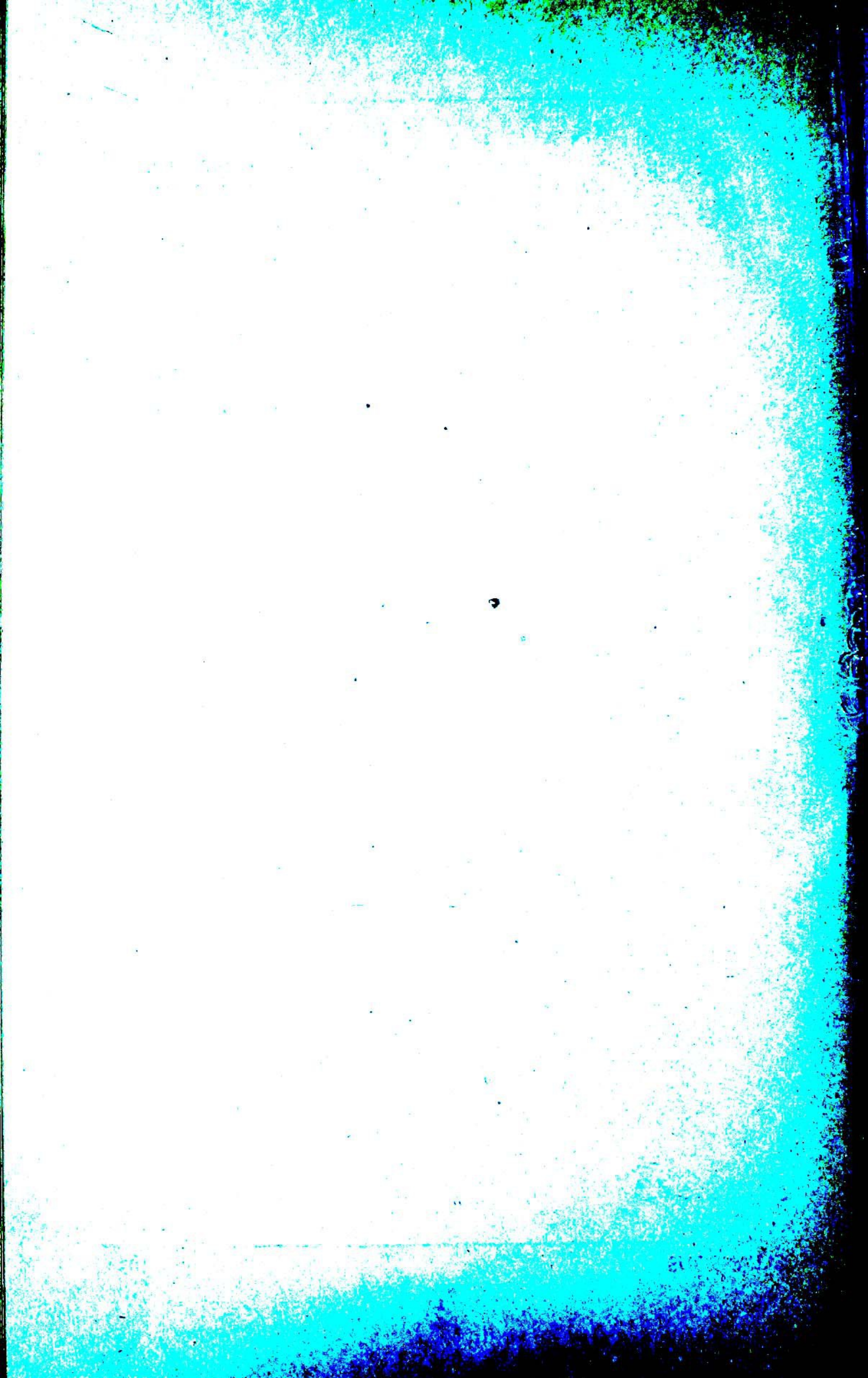
